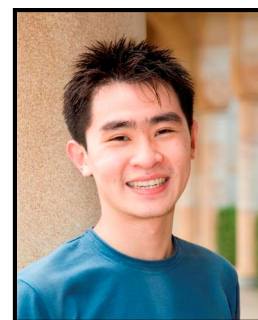


UCSI students excel at The University of Queensland in Australia
